Classical Civilisation and Ancient History

- I. How can we decide which are the great Classical (ie Greek and Roman) works and authors?
- 2. What did it mean to be 'Greek' in Classical times (ie 5th century BC)?
- 3. How was the political world of the ancient Roman Empire similar to ours today?

Economics

- I. Are increases in income taxes the most efficient way to increase government revenue?
- 2. For a product of your choice explain how price changes affect the quantity demanded and supplied.

Geography

- 1. "Population change presents the greatest challenge to humanity in the next century". To what extent do you agree? Justify your answer.
- 2. With reference to one named place or area you have studied, explain how and why it is of interest to a Geographer.
- **3.** "Using one or more examples, discuss the extent to which human activities influence different landscapes".

History

- I. With reference to any leader you have studied, evaluate the extent to which they achieved their aims after coming to power.
- 2. "The charm of history and its enigmatic lesson consist in the fact that, from age to age, nothing changes and yet everything is completely different." (Aldous Huxley) Discuss.
- 3. Explain the main aspects of either communism or fascism, and show what impact they had on a country you have studied.

Philosophy and Religion

- 1. "God is the highest ideal that humans have imagined". To what extent do you agree with this statement?
- 2. How do you know that you exist?
- 3. Is it ever right to tell a lie?

Politics

- 1. How successful has coalition government been in the UK?
- 2. To what extent is there a 'participation crisis' in UK democracy?
- 3. Is America now ungovernable?
